MATCH OPEN TO: All JROTC, Club, 4H, CMP, Scout and American Legion Junior Air Rifle Sporter/ Precision Teams & Individuals.

MATCH ENTRIES: 1. Relay reservations on a first registered, first served basis.
2. Teams of Four or Individuals. 28 competitors (seven teams) per relay.
3. Participating teams and individuals should use the "Entry Form," telephone, email, or fax to request the best relay times. Kevin.Nash@n-ccs.org **Please forward names and CMP numbers minimum of one week prior to your match.**

ENTRY FEES: The entry fee is \$60 per team or \$15 per individual. Make check payable to:
"American Legion Post 48".

ENTRIES CLOSE: 1 March 2019.

RULES: The match will be conducted in accordance with the "2018-2020 National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rules." Coaches are encouraged to obtain a copy of the Rules from CMP by mail at PO Box 576, Port Clinton, OH 32452, or online at www.thecmp.org

SCHEDULE: 3x20 format, Plus 10 Shot Final. Match is 60 shots, 20 each in prone, standing, and kneeling with 10 Shot Final in standing. Targets are the NRA 5/10, ten bull target, ORION Scored. Up to 28 competitors (seven teams) per relay. **Relays start at 1500.** Please arrive not later than 45 minutes before your relay is scheduled to start. Coaching is restricted IAW referenced rules. Challenge period ends 30 minutes after scores are posted.

- CATEGORIES:** The category for completion shall be Sporter or Precision. All Equipment will conform to current National Standard 3-P Rules for the class.
Equipment Checks: Honor is the standard and expectation. Pre-competition visual checks will be conducted, and spots checks during competition may occur.
- SCORING:** Targets will be scored by **designated scorers using the Orion Scoring System.** Scoring will follow Section 8 of the “2018-2020 National Standard Three-Position Air Rifle Rules.” Ties will be broken iaw Section 8.6.
- AWARDS:** **General** - Ceremony immediately following last relay. All awards mailed on Monday if unable to attend ceremony.
Team Awards – An award will be presented to the First, Second, Third Place and Fourth Place Teams in Sporter and Precision Categories. (3 or more precision Teams required for Team awards in Precision. Individual awards will be awarded in Precision if there is at least one entry.) Please provide email and cell phone on registration form for timely communication on Awards and scores.
Individual Awards – Medals will be presented to the top three shooters overall and trophies to the top shooter in each position (3 trophies each position), in both categories at the completion of Final Relay. CMP Pins will be awarded each day.
Qualifying - This is a CMP Sanctioned Cup Match and points contribute toward CMP Distinguished Shooting awards.
- SAFETY:** 1. Safety must be the number one concern of all match officials, adult leaders, and competitors. Proper safety procedures will be enforced at all times.
IAW Section 2.0 2. During the competition, infractions will result in a warning for the first offense and disqualification for the second infraction.
3. Competitors will take their rifles in their cases to the line, handle their rifles on the line, and remove their rifles and cases from the line only when the Range Officer gives the command.
4. Coaches ensure competitors are familiar with normal range etiquette, e.g. general safety rules, match procedures, when to move equipment to/on/from the firing line, talking, etc.
- DIRECTIONS:** To American Legion Post 48: Take I-40 to exit 128, turn south toward HWY 70 on Fairgrove Church Road approximately .4 miles; at traffic light and intersection turn east (left) on HWY 70E and drive .9 miles making a right under the large yellow “Fairground” Sign onto American Legion Blvd. Down and up large hill .4 miles to Parking Lot and Legion Hall. **Alternate GPS Address- 1127 US HWY 70W, Newton NC 28658**
