### **Lesson 6: ENOCH**

#### **GENESIS 5:18-24**

6. Why did Enoch disappear?

## Lesson 6 Activity and Craft

**Translated to Heaven** Give each child a paper lunch sack. Have them cut cloud like shapes out of white construction paper and glue them to the front, back, and sides of the bag. Have them cut a small hole in the top of the bag and thread a piece of string about twice the length of the bag. Have them tie a knot on the end of the string at the bottom of the bag. On the other end of the string, have them tie a “man” cut out of construction paper (your students can make these men with as much detail as they like with markers or crayons). Turn the bag upside down so the “man” is plainly seen on the outside and slowly pull the string so that the man disappears inside the bag. Explain that the Lord translated Enoch; He took him up to be with Him without ever experiencing death. Did you know, we, as Christians look for the glorious “rapture” of the church when we will be caught up to meet the Lord in the air and be with Him forevermore?

**PRAYER** Lead the children in a prayer of thanksgiving for the rewards of the Lord. If there are any children in your class who have not yet responded to the Gospel, give them an opportunity.
