Story Time - Read the story to the children Lesson 98: ELIJAH HELPS A POOR WIDOW 1 KINGS 17:8-24

After a while the stream dried up where Elijah was staying because there was no rain in the land. Then the word of the Lord came to him, saying, "Get up! go now to Zarephath, in Zidon, and make your living-place there; I have given orders to a widow woman there to see that you have food to eat." So he got up and went to Zarephath; and when he came to the gate of the town, he saw a widow woman getting sticks together; and he called out to her said, Will you give me a little water in a container for me to drink? And when she was going to get it, he said to her, And with the water get me a small bit of bread. Then she said, By the life of the Lord your God, I have nothing but a little grain meal in my container, and a tiny drop of oil in the bottle; and now I am getting two sticks together so that I may go in and make it ready for me and my son, so that we may have a small meal before we die. And Elijah said to her, Have no fear; go and do just as you have said, but first make me a little cake out of it and come and give it to me, and then make something for yourself and your son. For this is the word of the Lord, the God of Israel: The container of grain meal will not run out, and the bottle will never be without oil, until the day when the Lord sends rain on the earth. So she went and did just as Elijah had said to do; and she and Elijah and her whole household had food for a long time. The container of grain meal did not run out, and the bottle was never without oil, just as the Lord had said by the mouth of Elijah. Now after this, the son of the woman of the house became sick, so sick that he had no breath left in him at all. The woman shouted at Elijah, "What have I done to you? I thought you were God's prophet. Did you come here to cause the death of my son as a reminder that I've sinned against God?" "Bring me your son," Elijah said. Then he took the boy from her arms and carried him upstairs to the room where he was staying. Elijah laid the boy on his bed and prayed, "LORD God, why did you do such a terrible thing to this woman? She's letting me stay here, and now you've let her son die." Elijah stretched himself out over the boy three times, while praying, "LORD God, bring this boy back to life!" The LORD answered Elijah's prayer, and the boy started breathing again. Elijah picked him up and carried him downstairs. He gave the boy to his mother and said, "Look, your son is alive." "You are God's prophet!" the woman replied. "Now I know that you really do speak for the LORD."

98. Elijah Helps A Poor Widow

Act it out!

Have the children take turns, one being Elijah, one being the Widow, and one being the boy.

Act out the part where the boy dies, then Elijah has the widow bring him the boy. Then Elijah takes him up to his room, then prays to the LORD, and the boy comes back to life again. Then Elijah brings the boy back downstairs and gives him to his mother. Then let the mother tell Elijah "You are really God's prophet!"

Pick a Word Review

Before class choose 20 - 25 key words from today's lesson (i.e.: flour, Elijah, widow, etc.). Write them on a small piece of paper and place them in a bowl. Pass the bowl around class and have each child pick one word each. After everyone has chosen a word allow the children to take turns sharing what their word is and how it is important for today's lesson.

PRAYER
