Story Time - Read the story to the children Lesson 201: THE PROMISE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT JOHN 7:37-39

The last day of the festival came. It was the most important day. On that day Jesus stood up and said loudly, "Whoever is thirsty may come to me and drink. If anyone believes in me, rivers of living water will flow out from their heart. That is what the Scriptures say." Jesus was talking about the Holy Spirit. The Spirit had not yet been given to people, because Jesus had not yet been raised to glory. But later, those who believed in Jesus would receive the Spirit.

YOU'RE INVITED!

Make "telephones" with two small paper cups and string. Poke a small hole in the bottom of each cup and tread the string through, knotting it large enough that it will not come out. Have the children "call" each other and invite them to come to Jesus and be filled with living water. (Sound will travel through the string as long as it is taut and not touching any other objects.)

OPTIONAL ACTIVITY THIRSTY THEO GETS FILLED

Cut out two "men" from a sponge. Put each in a pie tin or cake pan. Explain that one, Thirsty Theo, wanted to be a good Christian boy but did not really know how. He tried to act like other Christians, but he was still dry and thirsty (drop a drop of water on Theo with an eye dropper).
