Story Time - Read the story to the children Lesson 225: THE WIDOW'S MITE LUKE 21:1-4

Begin today's lesson with showing the children the Optical Illusions provided in the back of this lesson. Once they have seen them all, tell the children "Things aren't always the way they seem!"

Then read the story to the children.

Jesus looked up and saw some rich people putting their gifts to God into the Temple collection box. Then he saw a poor widow put two small copper coins called mites into the box. He said, "I tell you the truth -This poor widow gave only two small coins. But she gave more than all those rich people. They have plenty, and they gave only what they did not need. This woman is very poor, but she gave all she had to live on."

Explain that the rich men in the Temple gave a lot of money and usually let everyone see how much they were giving! But they only gave God their "extra" money - they didn't need it. They just wanted to look good to show people how much they were able to give God.

The widow only gave two little copper coins, not even enough money to buy some bread, but Jesus said that she gave more than all the other rich people gave! Why? Because she gave all that she had, which showed that she trusted God to provide for her, and that everything comes from Him in the first place! Things aren't always what they seem, and God can see our hearts when we give to Him! Other people may see us do something, but only God knows our hearts - things aren't always what they seem!








