Digestive problems

Digestive issues can vary from the occasional windy or gurgly tummy to diarrhoea, pancreatic insufficiency or something more serious which will require veterinary attention. The digestive system can be maintained in good health by careful dietary considerations and the use of our Digestive Tablets to support the whole digestive system and keep it in good health.

Intestinal disorders

Minor digestive disorders in the colon or stomach are often when the digestive system has become inflamed and irritated, and these can be difficult to control and manage long term. If veterinary treatment is not required, these can usually be helped by soothing the digestive tract.

Poor digestion and malabsorption

When food passes through the system too quickly, sufficient nutrients cannot be absorbed. Slowing down the passage of food and soothing the digestive tract is beneficial to gain the most from their food.

Diarrhoea

If this persists for more than a few days you should seek veterinary advice but for temporary diarrhoea, often caused by eating something unsuitable, it is possible to control and firm the motions both during the acute stage and the recovery period afterwards.

Tree Barks Powder

The two powdered tree barks in this herbal nutritional supplement have a soothing effect on the digestive tract, slowing the passage of food and increasing absorption of nutrients, firming stools and easing discomfort.
