## BAD MANNERED / ROUGH CHARACTERS

- RUDENESS
- Actively follow bad manners that may offend or annoy people
- People of civilized group behaving in an uncivilized manner
- A/F

- Lack of respect
- Insults others
- Mind, Rude. coarse, insolent ${ }^{B}$
- Mind. Contemptuous, mocking. Scornful, insolence

- ImPERTINENCE
- Impertinence \& Insolence are synonyms with almost similar medicines.



## Impetuous

- Very quickly put action to an idea or desire, which comes suddenly to their mind: without careful consideration
- Fits of Anger + Aggressive instincts $->$ Performed with violent force

- Marked by force and violent movement or action
- They behave or acting in such a way that he is extra ordinarily hurry or impatient to get his work done.

## ABRUPT

- Unexpectedly sudden ; without notice
- Disconnected/ terminating suddenly
- Lack of discipline. lack of formality, lack of rule regulation with sudden. unexpected act.
- To the point of rudeness

- Nat-m
- projected anger', reveals the impulsive ( 'Impetuous' ), uncontrollable and irritable ('Irritability') side of the remedy, and better in the evening (`Irritability, evening, amel. in' ).
- He dislikes intensely people who make a fuss and try to comfort him, as he feels he will be more exposed ( 'Irritability, consolation agg.' ).
- Tarent
- Deferred attention or love -> Destruction even self abruptly
- Aur.met
- Idealistic -> Critical -> Suspicious / Dissatisfaction
- Kali. Carb - irritable, angry and rebellious - compensatory reactions to his feelings of vulnerability, ‘Consolation agg:. 'Impetuous'
- Nux.vom - Nux Vomica don't have depression of Kali-carb ; he gets depressed only in the final stages of pathology, $->$ becomes tired of living and longs to die, with and thoughts of suicide. BUT he lacks the courage - Kali Carb. has neither the wish to die nor suicidal thoughts.
- Puls - She weeps mild, with unprotesting tears that beg for an affectionate hand to wipe them away, Quite unlike the abrupt treatment that well-wishers receive from Kali Carb., who complains loudly until people respond, and then treats them badly. (Consolation amel)



## Impulsive

- An inner driving force to carry out some action, by present feeling. acting suddenly with no thought for the consequences : Not doing deliberately
- An impulsive control disorder
- His manner of action is with a sudden force, which is not expected from a normal person

- In Impetuous - He is violent in achieving his goal EXTRAORDINARILY HURRY
- In Hurry - a person's wants to do things in a haste and there is no excitement - PHYSICALLY RESTLESS
- In Impatience, the person is MENTALLY RESTLESS one cant wait, no reason, only a tendency
- HASTINESS (HURRY)
