## CENSORIOUS

• MIND - CENSORIOUS, critical K

Tendency to point out at fault of others

and those are true to their conviction

Loves to identify the shortcomings in others and to let them know of them



• ARS ALB - PERFECTIONISM - He cannot overlook an error or inadequacy in his work, no matter how insignificant; he is compelled to continue working until he is satisfied with the results. It is this inner drive for perfectionism that leads him to be very critical, very censorious of others. He readily criticizes anything done by anyone else, and his keen perception readily brings any existing imperfection to light. He is exhaustively fault-finding: the stove is burning too high, the light in the room is too low, his shoes are not in the right place, etc.

 VERATRUM ALBUM – the person exhibits righteousness more of a religious nature. The person will believe himself to be superior to those around him. He may become overly critical, censorious. More from HAUGHTINESS. As this tendency grows, the person becomes less in touch with the discrepancy between his reality and others; he may believe himself to be the only one who is sane, all the others being insane. Finally, this develops the full religious righteousness.

#### CALUMINATE/ SLANDER DISPOSITION

No, no...
This isn't gossip
It's the truth.

CALUMNIATE, desire to (See Slander) K

- They purposefully make false statements, consciously knowing that it is not true and in order to harm one's reputation
- To say untrue bad things in the presence of another person



One blames others for something wrong, though it is not likely so.
 Here, there is no intention to harm their reputation but he makes others responsible for something bad or mistake which is not actually so

### REPROACHES OTHERS

- Self Esteem remedy:
- Believes that I can't go wrong
- · Hence blames others.
  - Eg. a wife says my husband always finds faults with others.
  - · So its not only censorious & critical, but also blaming others.

# REMORSE

 Anxiety or guilt or deep regret for what has already happened/ wrong committed

# Moral Anguish

- Eg: sad and angry about investing and losing money in stock market.
- MIND Remorse, condemned feeling, etc. B
  - excessive: (1) Merc.

### ANXIETY OF CONSCIENCE

- Feeling guilty of an action and behavior that could presumably hurt someone i.e thinking that he may hurt someone in future
  - whereas remorse is related to something that has already happened.
- Eg: Patient comes with his complaints written down in a piece of paper so that he doesn't use much time of the physician as many patients are waiting outside
- Patients feeling that they have committed a crime by falling sick. In their illness also ,they are more considerate more towards their family.

## • MIND - ANXIETY - conscience, of (as if guilty of a crime) K
