ABSENTMINDED

Not attentive, being somewhere else



- Often FORGETS things or doesn't PAY ATTENTION to what is happening near him because they are thinking about other things; His ATTENTION TO PRESENT SITUATION is very less
- No fixation of mind at all, NOT FOCUSED; in variety of thoughts
- SMALL STIMULI needed PSORA

• MIND - ABSENCE OF MIND, lost in thoughts, absent minded B

MIND – ABSENCE OF MIND [™]

• MIND - UNOBSERVING (=Inattentive) K

- MEDORRHINUM absent or 'spaced-out' tendency to forget words, (Kent: 'Forgetful of his own name'). Like Phosphorus, Medorrhinum lives either in the present or in the future, - the inability to remember what has just been said or done, what he was about to say, or what he did yesterday. He may be able to retain all the facts he needs to sit an important examination, but be quite unable to tell you what he had for breakfast. Or he may run to the top of the stairs, and then be unable to remember what he had gone upstairs for.
- In this sense, Medorrhinum is sometimes scatterbrained and unfocussed. It can become extreme as a result of stress, and also from abusing drugs



ABSENTMINDED: "Now did I come here to put things inside the fridge or out?".. Inattentive.. Can be brought back by slight stimulus...

Psoric

Absorbed, buried in thoughts


- Mind fixed to certain thoughts MORE FOCUSED
- Totally engaged in a single problem
- Introspective, not realizing what is happening around him
- STRONG STIMULI Sycotic
- REVERIES (See Absorbed)



ABSORBED..Thinking deeply about something in her surroundings like book, TV.. Can only be brought back to normal by strong stimulus... Sycotic.. Intellectual

Abstraction of mind

- Person TOTALLY OUT OF REALITY, separated from rest of the world
- Thinking deeply of something out of one's surroundings CREATING
 AN IMAGINARY WORLD
- Visualizing/ Hearing something out of the present
- Perceiving something that is not present in the moment
 - DELUSION, ILLUSION, HALLUCINATION
- Going to schizophrenia
- VERY VERY STRONG STIMULUSER Symphilitic




ABSTRACTION: thinking something deeply out of his surroundings. While reading pauses for sometime but still looking in book!! Needs strong stimulus.. Syphilitic

ABSENT IN THE MOMENT

- LOST SOMEWHERE; SCATTERED ABSENTMINDED
- LOST IN ONE PARTICULAR THING IN AN ENGROSSED MANNER ABSORBED
- ENGROSSED BUT YOU CANNOT AROUSE HER FROM THE IMAGINARY WORLD – ABSTRACTION

FORGETFUL

- MIND MEMORY, weakness of K
- MIND Memory poor, weak, forgetful, etc. B
- Intellect Memory weak T
- Intellect Memory lost T



'Day-dream' is a set of pleasant thoughts that one would like to achieve in the future; though those can be made successful in reality, after rising from thought, he forgets them as a dream and does nothing to make them fruitful.

'Fancies, absorbed in' is being too deeply buried in imagination of something in mind, which are either pleasant or unpleasant, but quite unreal.

Ex- If a man earns Seven thousand rupees monthly, but always thinking that one day he will reach Seventy thousand and will live a luxurious life, but practically he does nothing for it, it is an example of 'daydreaming'.

If one imagines that he became an emperor, he is roaming with dozens of beautiful queens and servants are bowing in front of him, it is called 'Absorbed in fancy'.

The 'ambition' is to achieve something in reality, whereas 'daydream' and 'Fancies, absorbed in' are just temporary

'Theorizing' means having unreasonable objectives or irrational plans, those have no practical use. They are very theoretical; they make plans or ideas which usually become unsuccessful.

Some patients develop a set of ideas of their own to explain their own disease. They explain that why they have been diseased and what may be the probable causes etc. By guesswork, without doing any laboratory investigation, evidence, they try to guess the cause; these people come under this rubric.




THEORIZING
