- who do not like spending money or other resources **even the occasion requires** to do so

- **AVARICE** K. T. B

- Excessive or insatiable desire to gain more and more wealth

- It is not only a **desire to gain wealth**

but also a desire to withhold it from needy people

- very calculative





- **COVETOUS** ^K (See Avarice)
 - Patient challenges the consultation fee
 - Walking long distances to save the bus fare
 - Delighted when he gets a discount
 - Protests when the price goes high
 - Never spends money on things which lose value

- BBQR – MIND Avarice, covetous
- PARSIMONY – CR – Avarice
 - Exaggerated form of avarice

ARS ALB

- **Possessive quality** - extends to physical possessions, and people.
- **Miserly, avaricious.**
 - Conscious of saving money and things.
 - Always calculating the returns to him
 - He may be generous with his money or possessions, but he is still giving with the **expectation of receiving in return**, and he will be upset if the returns do not come back to him.
 - **Compulsive collecting nature** - insignificant little item, he will carefully store it

- **BRYONIA** – MATERIALISTIC– He is always busy and thinks about his work or his business all the time. Avarice with a desire to have material objects and make plenty of money. Fear of poverty.
- **CALC. FLOUR** – Anxiety about money matters. These people suffer from a baseless fear that they might become needy and poor, and that they will soon be 'running astern' financially. This fear of poverty may create miserly avaricious behaviour, a 'disposition to set a higher value on money than is natural to them.'

GREED S

- This person wants to get something continuously especially food or money
- May be spendthrift, but wants more and more of it
- Ars alb – both avarice and greedy
- Verat – greedy but spendthrift
