

TEASING: intentionally making fun of others, to hurt them

MOCKING K

- FALSE HUMOURIST
- Element of INDIRECT AGGRESSION
- · Humiliate or ridicule others due to their scornful attitude

- MIND MOCKING: (7) ars. chin. ip. Lach. par. plat. tarent.
 - his relatives: (1) sec.

JESTING K

- NEVER MISSES A CHANCE TO TELL A FUNNY STORY
- Aim to amuse & impress everyone
- WITTY

• MIND - JESTING - puns, makes: (1) cann-i



ANTICS PLAYS K

GROTESQUELY LUDICROUS ACT OR ACTION.

- Absurd/ foolish/ silly character
- This is commonly observed in children who are in the habit of making fun and gesticulating in classroom. A natural phenomena, but can happen involuntarily in diseased condition or in elders also
- To attract the attention of others

- MIND DELIRIUM absurd things, does: (1) sec.
- MIND DELUSIONS, absurd, ludicrous: (1) cann-I
- MIND GESTURES, makes ridiculous or foolish.
- MIND ATTITUDES, assumes strange: (1) plb.
- MIND STRANGE, things, impulse to do: (1) cact.
- MIND GRIMACES

CHILDISH BEHAVIOUR K

 These people though they have crossed the age of maturity, behave like children; but they have normal intelligence

Some of their attitude & behaviour are VERY IMMATURE

just like a child



CHILDISH BEHAVIOUR

- more childish than their age
- who use baby language
- sucking thumb



- MIND DELUSIONS, child, childish fantasies, has: (1) lyc.
- MIND SPEECH, babbling childish: (2) acon. Arg-n.
- FACE EXPRESSION, childish: (2) Anac. nux-m.



BUFFOONERY K

- BUFFOONERY (See Foolish behavior)
- An IRRATIONAL BEHAVIOUR lacking in judgment, consideration or intelligence
- The behaviour is so strange that he can be judged to be in a state of delirium and while talking, he has no regards to the position or status of the person he is talking with. He may go on talking by which his action may be assumed to be foolish.

FOOLISH BEHAVIOUR K

 These people don't think sensibly while doing something, because they LACK GOOD JUDGEMENT CAPACITY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THEIR AGE

- Irrespective of age
- MIND LUDICROUS, things seem: (See Foolish behavior)
 - (4) cann-s. nat-m. *Nux-m.* stram.

- Mischievous often done on others which may disturb or harm others, but main aim is to make fun
- Antics plays silly or amusing behaviour to draw attention of others, but they don't disturb or make problems to others directly
- Playful high spirited and fun loving, enjoy lively games, but not in a way that hurt others
- Mocking unkind jokes on others, to embarrass or upset them

- HYOS: the patient tries to attract attention by foolish behaviour
 , so ridiculous that it can provoke laughter; person is very
 excitable
- Foolish way through a lot of loud talk Foolishly loquacious;
- They are quite suspicious and mistrustful foolishly keep asking the physician the same questions repeatedly, this can elicit laughter and make them appear ridiculous. Their talk may be Naïve and Childish
- Foolish laughter Disposition to make a jest of everything



STUPIDITY K

- An unintelligent behaviour or action, which can be easily judged by somebody.
- DULL intellectually and they are not doing such acts deliberately
- . STUPIDITY (See Dulness)
- FACE Expression dull, stupid: (2) Bapt. Bar-c.

- They require mental rest



IMBECILE K



- Person with moderate mental retardation
- Capable of some degree of communication and ability to do simple tasks under supervision
- Has some degree of intellect, but uses it improperly
- Doesn't develop beyond the mental age of a normal 5 7 yr old child

- MIND IMBECILITY old rags are as fine as silk:
 SULPH.
- MIND DELUSIONS, old rags are as fine as silk: (1) SULPH.
- MIND DELUSIONS, beautiful rags seem, even: (1) Sulph.
- MIND DELUSIONS, clothes is clad in rags: (1) Cann-i.

IDIOCY K

- Person with EXTREME MENTAL RETARDATION
- Unable to learn connected speech or recognize the common dangers
- Person doesn't develop beyond the mental age of a normal four year old child

- Slowness

- MIND Ridicule, mocking, scoffing, sarcasm, etc

- MIND Childish, simple
- MIND Laughter childish: (2) bar-c. croc.
- MIND Buffoonery
