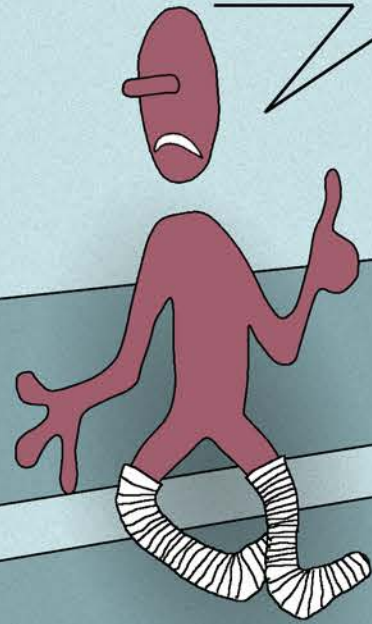

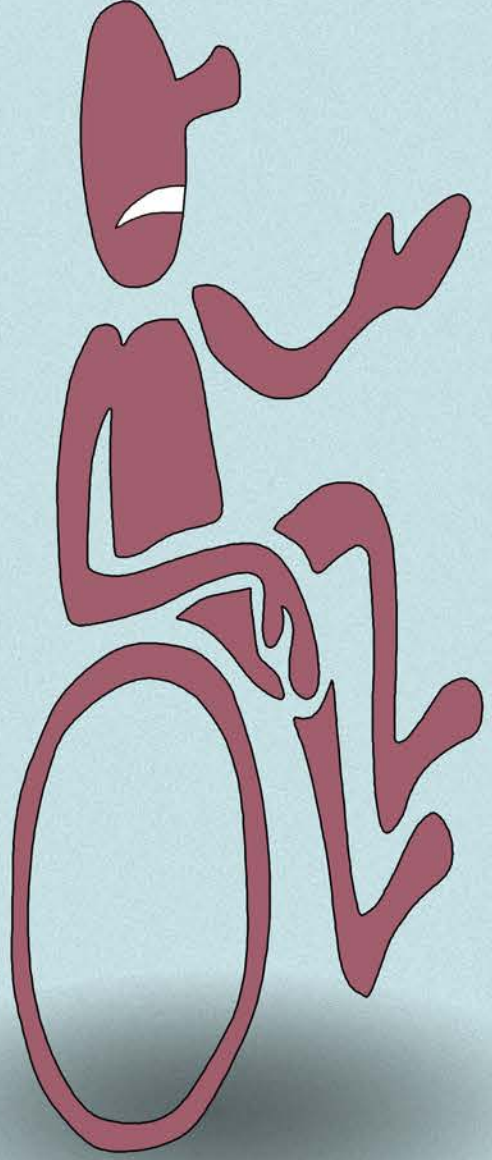

- 11 million (19%) disabled people
- 1.2 million wheelchair users
- Polio eradicated in 1988

NIGERIA

- 25 million (14%) disabled people
- No data for total wheelchair users
- Polio eradicated in 2015
- 7000 polio related paralysis (in need of wheelchair) - 2011

CITIES

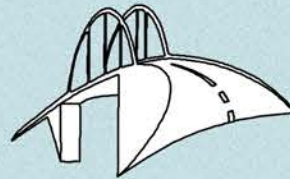
- Inaccessible public buildings

BUILDINGS



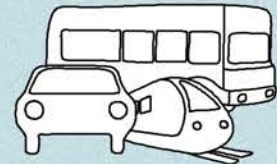
- Lack of pathways, pavements, zebra crossings and dropped curbs

INFRASTRUCTURE



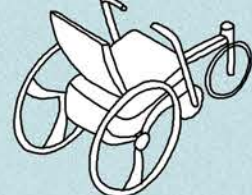
- Inaccessible public and private transport

TRANSPORTATION

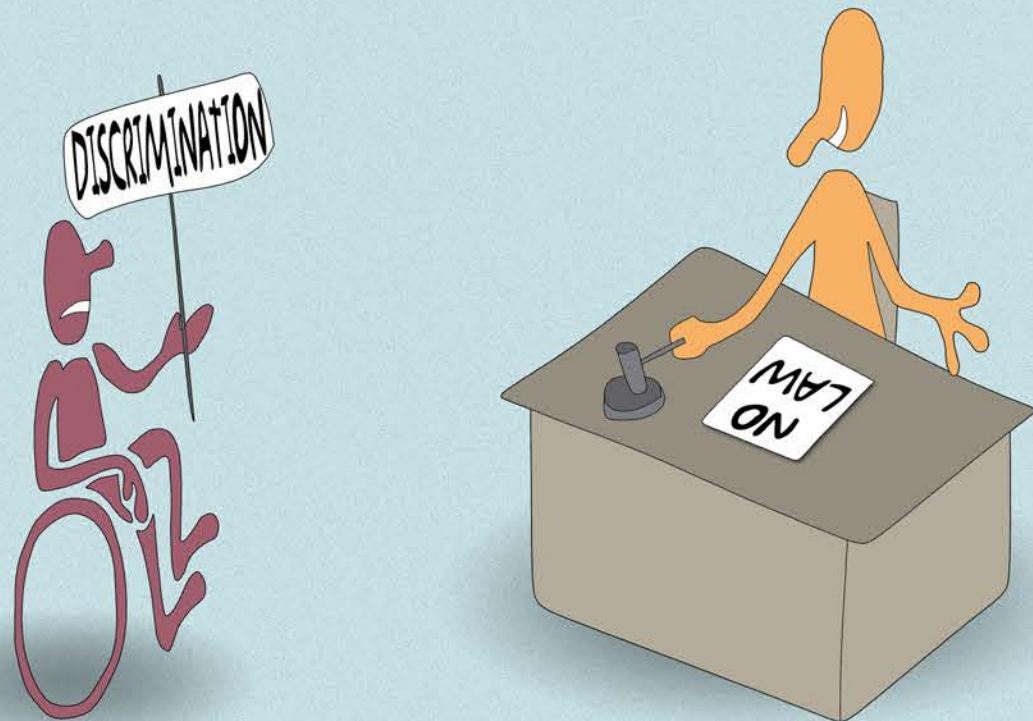


- Lack of technical knowledge and expertise

INSTITUTIONAL CHALLENGES

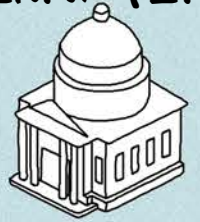


- Lack of discrimination and disability laws

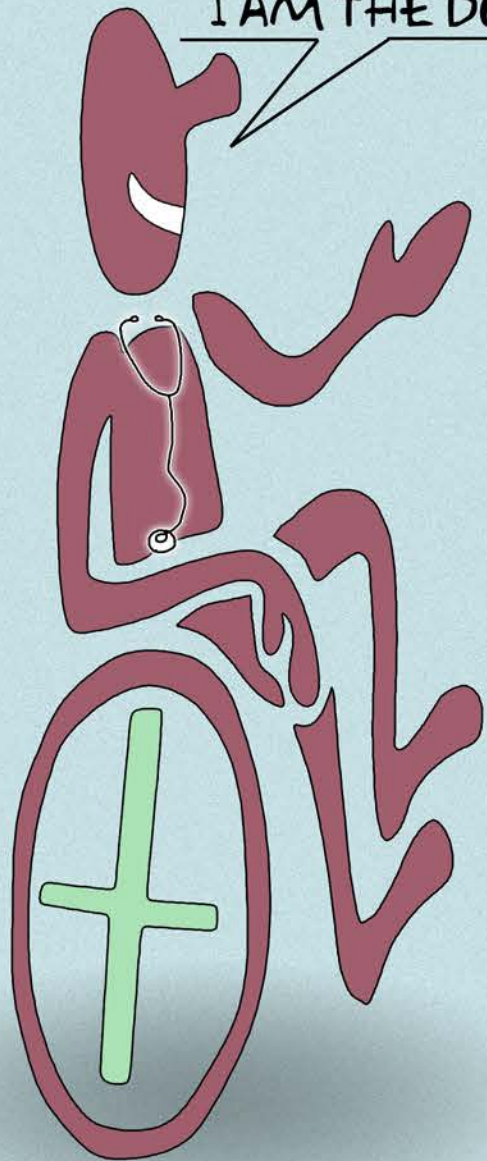
Outcomes:
