# LYONS MILL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PTA Literacy Corner – NOVEMBER 2020

## Why does literacy matter?

Literacy affects the lives of children and adults in many ways. It impacts how we communicate and interact with one another and the world around us. According to the National Council of Teachers of English, there is a correlation between high levels of literacy and economic opportunity, better nutrition and environmental sustainability. In the school setting, students are expected to utilize literacy skills in every subject area including specials. Students who do not develop strong literacy skills struggle to grasp important concepts, can become frustrated and may exhibit inappropriate behaviors such as aggression or emotional outbursts.

#### Ways to support literacy at home

1. Offer opportunities for your child to explore diverse stories. This will help them gain an understanding about the cultures and experiences of others.

2. Use a recipe to make a meal or bake together. Not only do recipes offer opportunities for students to practice their reading skills, they also support math learning by developing or strengthening a child's understanding of measurement. You could incorporate writing by having your child write their own recipe or create a menu that includes some of their favorite foods, beverages and desserts.

# What will students learn this month?

## <u>5th Grade</u>

Essential Question: What does it take to put a plan into action? In reading, students will determine the theme of a story by analyzing the characters' words, thoughts and interactions in order to understand the author's message. They will also compare and contrast characters in a story by analyzing their interactions and reactions at different points in the story in order to understand how chacters change. In writing, students will develop a topic by using main ideas and details in order to organize their ideas and explain points to the reader more clearly.
