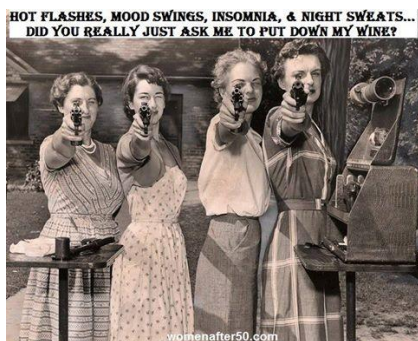
VISIT FROM FIREFIGHTERS

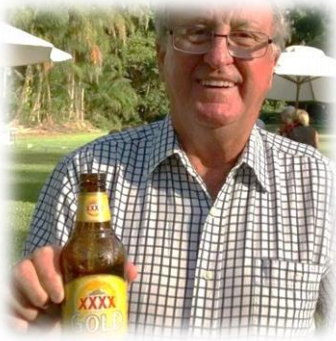

PROFILE OF THE MONTH



Behind every successful man is a very understanding woman????? This definitely applies to our man of the month. Our Profile is all about our Champion bowler and champion bloke - Peter Johnson. It's hard to keep performing at the top for so many years but Peter has done and is still doing just that. I'd like to list his achievements for you all to appreciate just what this man has done. Born in Tasmania, Peter left his Island home to play Aussie rules for Wilston Grange in Senior League Queensland for 1 year then home to Tassie. He met his beautiful soul mate Lainie in 1974 and in 1978 on New Year's

Eve they tied the knot.  Peter and Lainie had 3 children, Karl 1986, Trent 1990 and Amy 1991. Sadly Trent, a premature birth only survived 19 days as Laine was very ill with septicemia and lucky to survive herself.

Peter finished his football and coaching career in 1980 and started playing Lawn Bowls.

In 1987 Peter bought a Taxi Licence and burned the midnight oil with his day job and taxi driving at night and weekends for almost 4 years. Sleep was a bonus. During this period Pete only played Club and District bowls. In 1992 he leased the Taxi Licence out and started playing more bowls and then in 1994 sold the Taxi Licence. That same year they purchased a rental property in Coolum and a unit at Kings Beach. 2007 came with the sale of both properties and the purchase of a townhouse at Shelly Beach which they rented out until retirement in 2015. Peter

joined Kawana Bowls Club and played there for 3 years before joining Caloundra. At Enoggera he won the Novice and "B" singles in 1981 and played lead for 6 years in Pennant. Other Clubs Peter played for were Everton Park, Ferny Grove and New Farm. In his 30 odd years of playing in the Brisbane District Peter won District Titles, comprising of 2 Singles, 2 Pairs 2 Fours and 1 Triples. In 1986 he played for a Queensland reserve side against South Australia at Yeronga. This was a warm up for SA to play a test series against Queensland the following 2 days. Pete was told by people in the know that he was a big chance of being selected for Queensland in the upcoming Australian State Sides

Championship and was asked to play in the final trial squad on December 13th 1986.....however Lainie, heavily pregnant with Karl decided that was the day Karl was to be born and he wasn't going to miss the birth of their first child. Hence, he missed the trial and never heard from those selectors again!!! *Their loss!*

Besides Bowls and Aussie Rules, other sports played included Cricket, Soccer and Golf.

Bowls titles so far.....

Numerous at several clubs but the only Club that deprived him of an "A" Singles title was Ferny Grove. As we stated Peter won 7 District titles in Brisbane District and 1 in the Sunshine Coast with Ed Boxall who became a formidable pair going on the defeat fancied players to win. In 1993 Peter won the Prestigious Maroochy New Years Singles in a knockout 3 day event. This tournament attracted the best players around so that was a great win. 1994 State Fours title, 2004 State Mixed Pairs. 2016/2017 State Representative. Pete admits to favoring Pairs play by far followed by Fours, Singles and Triples a distant last. His **most admired player** is/was Rob Parella. It was from watching the legend on ABC TV Jack High

series that took his interest to play Lawn Bowls. He later got to know Rob quite well as he was a Taxi owner too, Brilliant bowler But a



on the Green, He would do or say anything to put you off your game. Off the Green he was a thorough gentleman and really easy to talk to about bowls.

Best advice he was given by a former State Player, Alex Matthews. "Very few Bowlers make a living out of bowls and they are too hard to eat." Alex told Peter he'd lost a house and his marriage because he thought he was good enough at the time to make big money out of the game but he was wrong. When Peter bought the Taxi he recalled those words. Work hard, Plenty of time for Bowls after you get set up.

Peter and now Lainie, (who with coaching from the maestro) are much loved and admired members of our wonderful Club and we feel blessed to call them friends. However, if it comes to dancing! Lainie has the moves and Peter tries

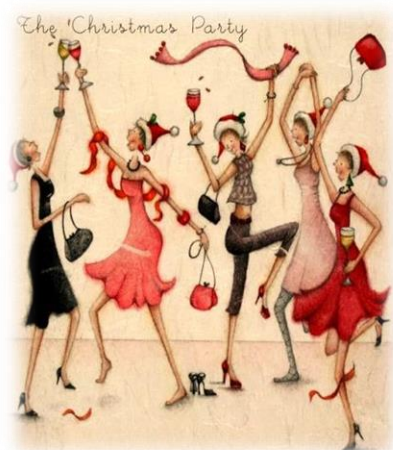
