Statement of Need: Stroke is the fifth leading cause of death in the United States and second leading cause of death globally. Stroke incidence and mortality have declined in recent decades which reflect the commitment made by the American Heart Association/American Stroke Association to reduce stroke, coronary heart disease and cardiovascular risk. The decrease in incidence and mortality from stoke is due to improved recognition and awareness as well as the provision of faster care during acute stroke. Advances in preventive measures targeting ischemic stroke have also decreased rates of incidence and mortality. To continue this trend of improving overall stroke care, healthcare providers must remain committed, open, and up-to-date on current best-practices for management of stroke.
