Phelps Critical Care Courses:

Critical Care Cardiac Arrhythmia (5 weeks):

This is for the Registered Nurse and is required for RNs who wish to care for a critically ill patient or patients requiring cardiac monitoring. Critical care areas are ED, ICU, 5 South (Telemetry), PACU, Radiology. Employees who are nursing students are allowed to take this course if cardiology is completed in their nursing program. Calipers are required. Magnifying glass or card is recommended. Course is given over <u>5 weeks</u>. Dates:

Pink Slips: Just a reminder about the use of pink slips.....

After using a Pink Slip to transfer a patient from one surface to another, <u>remove the Pink Slip before</u> <u>transporting</u> the patient to another department. Transporting the patient while they are lying on a Pink Slip creates a safety risk. Remove the Pink Slip from under the patient, fold it, and take it with the patient so that it may be used in the next department.

Flex Staff: Flex staff are nursing assistants and are only permitted to do vital signs and activities of daily living which include hygiene, toileting, oral care, turning and positioning, skin care, etc.

They are not working under a technician job description. They **may not perform** accuchecks, bladder scans, EKGs, phlebotomy, etc. Please do not ask them to do these activities.

Alaris IV Pumps: Despite the changes to the Alaris Guardrails Program you still need to program IV solutions using Guardrails IV Fluids:

IVF: 1 - 30 mL/h IVF: 31- 300 mL/h	
IVF: 31- 300 mL/h	
IVF: 301- 999 mL/h	
IVF + KCL 10 mEq/L	
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The above selections replace the previous choices of D5 ½ Normal Saline, Lactated Ringer's, etc. Do Not Program Using Basic Infusion.

<u>Face Sheets</u>: Patient Face Sheets are no longer being printed in the ED. They need to be printed out when the patient is admitted to the unit.
