Do you know how to document that you educated your patient and/or family members on a patient's MDRO and/or Isolation Precautions?

THE JOINT COMMISSION NATIONAL PATIENT SAFETY GOAL (NPSG) #7 "IMPLEMENT EVIDENCE BASED PRACTICES TO PREVENT HEALTH CARE ASSOCIATED INFECTIONS" STATES TO EDUCATE PATIENTS AND/OR FAMILIES ABOUT HEALTH CARE ASSOCIATED INFECTION PREVENTION STRATEGIES I.E. ISOLATION PRECAUTIONS.

When a patient is found to have an MDRO (multi-drug resistant organism) whether they are colonized or infected with this organism we are required to educate the patient and/or family as well as initiate the proper isolation precautions. The Meditech intervention tool labeled "MDRO Education Reminder" guides you through the main points that need to be addressed as well as where to properly document this education. It is important to note that patients may be placed on isolation for other reasons besides an MDRO present i.e. Patients may be placed on Isolation for Communicable Diseases such as Influenza, Measles etc. Education on these communicable diseases as well as the appropriate isolation precautions should also be documented in the Multidisciplinary Teaching Record. This also applies to all "Rule outs of Communicable Diseases" i.e. R/O TB.
