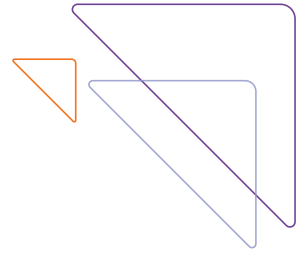

Statement of need: Over the past two decades, aortic surgery has evolved from a traditionally open surgical approach to a minimally invasive endovascular mechanism. As a result, there are many areas of uncertainty in caring for patients with aortic disease. This activity will clarify the guidelines for screening and early recognition to determine appropriate pathways for treatment, inclusive of aneurysms and dissections. This activity will address risk factors and identification of aortic disease and the role of multidisciplinary specialties and the team in its treatment, inclusive of the most advanced medical management techniques, surgical and endovascular options. Didactic lectures will focus on current research and technical advances in the management of aortic disease utilizing a collaborative team. Best practice strategies will be implemented for optimal patient outcomes.

Program objectives: All Northwell Health CME activities are designed to improve patient care, safety and outcomes. At the conclusion of this conference, participants should be able to:

- **Review** current guidelines for screening and early identification of patients with aortic disease.

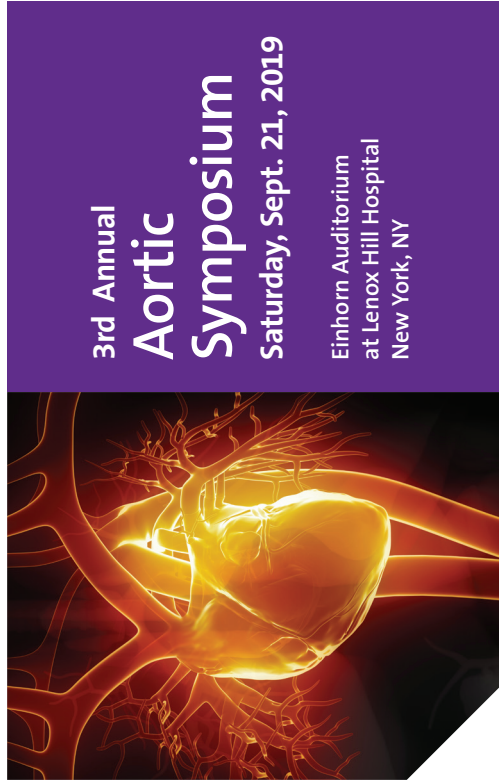
