We're back on our Magnet Journey for 2021!

If you have a *professional goal to become a chair or co-chair* of a unit or shared governance council, please let your nurse manager and/or Judy Dillworth know soon so that we can support you in this role.

Our clinical nurses drove full speed ahead during our shared governance council meetings on Wed 1/20/21. Themes for each of the councils were: to plan for more clinical nurses to chair/co-chair each of the councils, list the accomplishments of 2020 for the Nursing annual report, review each council's charter and establish goals for 2021. The main goals for each council were:

Recruitment Retention and Recognition Council: will be voting on the next recipient of the DAISY award (nominees from 4Q2020) and reviewing domains for the next NDNQI RN satisfaction survey (June 2021).

New Knowledge and Innovation Council: We need to "identify a question" in every unit/service for future research studies (strategic plan identifies # of IRB-approved studies/year identified by Mary; 2 IRB-approved studies are in progress). To be a principal investigator, you must be CITI-certified!

Professional Practice and Development Council: We need to set unit/organizational goals for BSN and professional certification. We will focus on supporting a Healthy work environment and becoming an "Age-Friendly" organization.

Quality and Safety Council: Besides sharing our quality improvement initiatives, we hope to clarify process and outcome measures for JC National Patient Safety Goals. Michelle Horvath provided an overview of the Root Cause Analysis (RCA) Process- more educational sessions to come.

CNO Advisory Council: Mary asked for suggestions regarding the format of this council (email her directly, Judy or Kathy). New members were welcomed and we hope to ensure consistent representation from all areas (inpatient and ambulatory) for an engaging dialogue.

The topic of Mentoring was discussed during the **APRN council** meeting on Tuesday, 1/12/21, chaired by Dorit Lubeck-Walsh. Thanks to Lincy Joseph, RN, NP who shared her experience as a recent graduate of Northwell's Mentorship program and Cherry Fuentes, MS, RN-BC, NPD-BC, who discussed the Mentorship program she started here at Phelps. By comparing/contrasting the two programs and facilitating an engaging dialogue among the members, the stage was set for the initiation of a mentorship program for NPs at Phelps.

NICHE (Nurses Improving the Care for Healthsystem Elders)

The Nursing Department is proud to announce it has received NICHE (Nurses Improving Care for Healthsystem Elders) Exemplar Status for the 5th year in a row! Exemplar designation is the highest of 4 levels of achievement. To achieve Exemplar designation indicates a hospital has demonstrated ongoing, high level dedication to geriatric care and implements interventions and initiatives to continually improve the care of the geriatric population.

Requirements for exemplar status include implementation of the NICHE Geriatric Resource Model, evidence-based protocols on patient care units, use of age-sensitive standards, inclusion of patients, families and community based providers in planning NICHE initiatives and involvement in leadership roles regionally.

- Education (under Communication) patient education videos from *The Wellness Network*
- EZ Call (under Communication)— enter email or phone number of family and a link will be sent
- Pluto TV (Entertainment) watch Live TV or Movies on Demand
- Language Line (under Communication Clinician, PIN Required) provides interpretation
- Amwell (Communication) Patient can talk to doctor

Recently, some of our Hospitality reps have been trained on the features of the tablet. *Please utilize this very important communication tool for our patients and their families.*
