Gowns	<ul> <li>Image: A start of the start of</li></ul>	Impervious/Fluid-resistant: Blood or body fluid risk, including aerosol-generating procedures (AGPs) such as intubation, regardless of patient's COVID-19 status. Remove if contaminated.Isolation: When there is no blood or body fluid risk. Remove if contaminated.
Eye protection (mask with face shield, face shield or goggles)	~	Use with suspected or confirmed COVID-19 patients, for all AGPs, and for all encounters with any individual who is unable to wear a mask. If reusing, disinfect with an Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) approved wipe, air dry, and place in labeled bag with name.
Procedure maskImage: Constraint of the second seco		Required to be worn at all times in the hospital, ambulatory or practice office settings. <b>Patients should wear a procedure mask when outside their room and in their room whenever possible.</b>
N95 respirator	~	Worn for all patient encounters where individuals have suspected or confirmed COVID-19 status. Worn for all AGPs regardless of patient's COVID-19 status. Discard after use. Between uses, store in breathable bag labeled with name.
