Placing on pressure redistribution surface. Utilizing cushions about 6x8 inches, used for neonatal. Made of gel like substance.</li> </ul>	What is a Concord position? Head is positioned to the left and is placed above the heart. Cervical collar for high- risk patients with potential spinal issues. We have had problems with facial pressure injuries from prone positioning (chin, ears, cheeks). We use the neonatal gel pillows. Have not had success with the foam proning pillows. Question: How many hours do you repositioning the head? Recommended Q2 hours. Respiratory tx must be present during repositioning for accidental extubation. Debi spoke about hospital acquired pressure injuries that develop from TED stockings and attempts to have them removed from provider order sets.
